Knowing that, I know not to take any undue chances. Again, this is all due to a general tendency that my calendar presents. Now about hexagram 63, I would like to impart upon you that hexagram 63 as indicated in the I Ching itself, is not necessarily an ending, in a sense it's the advent of a better foot hole as one climes the mountain of substantiality, so to speak. That's today, Oct. 2, 2014 (63) Once again, try this, look up some great person's birthday and you will be a surprise. A hint..., the greatest person you might know, be it a political leader, or that of your religious leader.
