Masking or camouflaging can reduce a person's sense of belonging, self-esteem, sense of self-worth, and close relationships - all of which are associated with poor outcomes. It can also lead to avoidance of opportunities, such as connection with other autistic individuals, that could increase quality of life. This Research Topic aims to showcase evidence on why the stigma surrounding autism and the prejudice against autistic people are so detrimental.
