I taught courses in agricultural ethics, history of farming in the Great Plains, world food and fiber crops, sustainable crop production, agricultural extension, and international agricultural development. My research areas were the interaction of crops and weeds, biological nitrogen fixation, and the distribution of the products of photosynthesis within plants. I am now retired.
