Poets Robert Frost and Theodore Enslin are seen reinvigorating the edgily «agrest» scene of invective in America. *Archeologies of Invective* situates itself also with respect to a psychohistorical terrain - altered states of consciousness reflecting Faustian transition: the dislocation of the peasant class, the empowerment of women as a heterological «state within a state,» the advent of modern weaponry, and the rise of alcohol - whose genealogy becomes nothing short of a «gin-eology.» Stable notions of character give way to impersonal, pantomimic terms of art, such as caliber; the hero is displaced by the wanderer, thief, madman, and clown. Not limiting itself to the literary canon, *Archeologies* includes analyses of gangster films and sports legends in the context of Arcadian motivation. Finally, Eisenhauer places Philip Roth's *American Pastoral* within the arc of 19th-century pastoral fiction, locating a prosaic «*Nowadays*» in which criticism is still inscribed, as evidenced by Fish's explication of pastoral in the context of professional correctness.

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
